Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed and required, to pay annually to William Hillman or order, a sum of money equal to the half-pay of a soldier, as a remuneration to the said William Hillman, for services rendered his country in the revolutionary war, and for relief from the indigence and misery which attend his old age. THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of James Semmes, of Charles county, late an officer in the revolutionary army, report, that they have had the same under consideration, and find in the Auditors certificate accompanying this report, that the petitioner served as a second lieutenant from the month of April seventeen hundred and seventy-seven, until July seventeen hundred and eighty-one, when he was paid in depreciation certificates, the balance of the pay due him; and to the knowledge of your committee the petitioner is very poor. They therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby required, to pay to James Semmes of Charles county, late a second lieutenant in the revolutionary war, or to his order annual or quarterly payments during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a second lieutenant.

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of John Davis, of Charles county, late a serjeant in the revolutionary war, report that they have had the same under their consideration, and find in the accompanying documents, that he enlisted as a soldier in the fourth Maryland Regiment, on the sixth day of December seventeen hundred and seventy-six; that on the first day of August, seven hundred and seventy nine, he was made a corporal, and on the first of January seventeen hundred and eighty, was promoted to a serjeant, and that he continued in the army until the end of the war, and your committee know him to be very poor; they therefore recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed, to pay to John Davis, of Charles county, late a serjeant in the revolutionary war, or to his order, during his life, annually in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a serjeant.
