

Mr. Evans delivers a bill entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road therein mentioned in Cecil county; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Warner delivers a bill entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to remit a part of the money paid by James Fletcher, for the materials of the old Court-house of said county; which was read.

The bill entitled, An act to lay out and open a road in Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Riggs the question was put, that the said bill be referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly. Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill for the relief of James L. Porter, of Cecil county; the bill for the benefit of Jesse Moffitt, of Kent county; the bill to lay out and open a road in Cecil county; and the bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to build a Carpenters hall in the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time and passed.

Mr. Boyer delivers a petition from John Balton, an old soldier, praying relief; which was read and referred to Messrs. Boyer, C. Hall and Graves.

Mr. Randall from the committee delivers the following report:

SATURDAY, December 12, 1812.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the benefit of James L. Porter; the bill to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Snow Hill; the bill to establish the Bank of Somerset; the bill to open a road from M'Shane's ferry to Crampton's gap in Washington county; the bill to lay out and make a public road in Cecil county; the bill for the benefit of Jesse Moffitt; the bill to lay out and open a road in Cecil county; and the bill to authorise a lottery for building a Carpenter's hall in the city of Baltimore; the resolution in favor of Jesse Wright; the resolution in favor of John Thompson; and the resolution in favor of Ingram Cann, were sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, An act to permit the removal of civil actions depending or brought in the several county courts within this State, to any county court of an adjoining county, was read the second time and the question put, shall the said bill pass? Mr. Bowles delivers a petition from Jonathan Tutwiler; and a petition from Samuel Nowell, both soldiers of the revolution, praying relief; which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Bowles, Sprigg and Lewis.

The report on the petition of Joshua Powers, was read the second time, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. Hogg delivers a petition from William Grace, and a petition from William Crouch, revolutionary soldiers, praying relief; which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Hogg, Evans and Lusby.

The resolution relative to the appointment of a treasurer for the eastern shore was read the second time, and the question put, that the blank in said resolution be filled up with Tuesday.
