So it was resolved in the affirmative and the message sent to the senate.

The bill supplementary to the act to incorporate a company for cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and Chesapeake Bay; the bill for the benefit of the heirs of James Wilson; the bill to make a public road in Queen Ann's county; the bill to incorporate the Elkton Library Company; the bill annulling the marriage of Elijah Shay and Rose Shay; the supplement to the act to establish pilots and regulate their fees; and the resolution in favor of Moses Greer, were sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, An act to establish a Bank and incorporate a company under the title of the Bank of Somerset; the bill for the benefit of James L. Porter, of Cecil county; the bill entitled, An act to permit the removal of civil actions depending or brought in the several county courts within this State, to any county court of an adjoining county; the bill for the relief and benefit of the representatives of William Emmit, deceased, of Frederick county, severally endorsed, "will not pass;" the bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a Carpenter's Hall, in the city of Baltimore; the bill entitled, A further additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to direct descents; the bill to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Snow Hill, in Worcester county; and the bill entitled, An act authorising and directing the levy court of Harford county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the erection of a room for the reception and safe keeping of criminals in said county, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

The house proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several Banks in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Perry moved the following amendment to be inserted after the second section :

**AND BE IT ENACTED,** That the charter of the several Banks now established in the State shall be, and are hereby extended to the first day of November eighteen hundred and thirty-five, until the end of the next session of Assembly thereafter, upon condition that the several Banks now established in the city of Baltimore and Washington county, subscribe for as much stock as will raise a fund necessary and sufficient to finish and complete the said road, each Bank subscribing in proportion to the amount of capital actually employed, subscribed up, or in operation by them, and to be paid or advanced in due proportion to the amount by each Bank subscribed in such periods, and at such times as the same may be wanted; and any increase of capital made by any of the said Banks shall at all succeeding payments thereafter be taken into consideration, and be considered as a part of the capital contemplated under this act; and upon the further condition that the said Banks in the city of Baltimore and Washington county, and the several Banks in this State shall elect and bid themselves to pay into the treasury of the Western Shore, the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ dollars for each year every year during the continuance of their respective charters as aforesaid under this law; the sum as aforesaid to be paid by the said Banks, shall be in proportion to their respective capitals paid or to be paid in, and which sum as aforesaid shall be and is hereby pledged as a fund for the purpose of supporting county schools."

On motion by Mr. Lecompte, the question was put, that the further consideration of the bill be postponed until the first day of June next. The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow :
