The house adjourns until to morrow morning nine o'clock.

SATURDAY, December 19, 1812.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Perry has leave of absence for the remainder of the session.

The speaker laid before the house a communication from the auditor general, which was read, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying for a supplement to the act passed at November session 1802, chapter 16, which was read, and referred to Messrs. Harryman, Stansbury and Randall.

Mr. Barney delivers a petition from Josias Stevenson, inspector of a tobacco warehouse in the city of Baltimore, praying that a law may pass supplementary to an act for his relief, passed at the last November session, which was read, and referred to Messrs. Barney, Warner and Stansbury.

The bill from the senate, entitled an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana Bridge, was read the second time, and the question put that the house receive the following as an amendment thereto:

After the words Christiana bridge, in the 6th section, insert "keeping the now public road from Elk Landing until it crosses Big Elk Creek, and thence." Resolved in the affirmative. The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The bill entitled an act to lay out and make public a road in Kent county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, an act to correct a mistake in the record therein mentioned, which was read.

On motion by Mr. Francis M. Hall, the question was put, that the house reconsider the bill entitled an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the district of Columbia. Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The bill entitled an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road between the streams of Big and Little Elk through the village of Elkton, and to build a bridge over said streams in Cecil county. The bill to alter the time of holding Baltimore county court, and the resolution in favor of John Burns, were sent to the senate.

The house then proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled an act to alter, change and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government which relate to the time and manner of electing the senate of this state, and the manner of filling up vacancies in that body. And on motion by Mr. Emory, the question was put, that the words "by general ticket" be inserted after the words by ballot, in the third section.
