Ringgold, late of Kent county, deceased; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Patton, of Talbot county; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Alice Craycroft; the bill entitled, an act to extend the same constitutional privileges to all persons conscientiously scrupulous of taking an oath as are now enjoyed by the religious societies called Quakers, Menonists, Tunkers, and Nicolites or New Quakers, and to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as are repugnant thereto; and the bill entitled, an act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as preclude the senate from making any amendment to a money bill, were sent to the senate.

The question was put, that the house reconsider the bill entitled, an act to alter the time of holding Baltimore county court. Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for draining a branch or swamp called Bee-tree Swamp, lying in Caroline county; and the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of John Burgoine, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state was sent to the senate.

The resolution in favor of the examaminer general was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled, an act authorising an appropriation for the penitentiary of this state, and on motion by Mr. Stansbury, the question was put, that the blank in said bill be filled up with eleven thousand seven hundred and sixty seven dollars and forty seven cents.
