

On motion by Mr. Evans, the following resolution was read, assented to and sent to the senate: Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Robert Crouch, or his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war. The clerk of the senate delivers the engrossed bills, Nos. 180, 181, 182, 183, 184, 185, 192 and 193 endorsed, "assented to." The bill entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. And the following messages.

Worthington and John Schutes, witnesses, by a resolution, the sum of twenty four dollars ; Jubb Fowler for house rent, thirty three dollars ; Serjeant at Arms, the sum of thirty four dollars ; Louis Gassaway, Clerk, the sum of thirty nine dollars and sixty cents ; Jonas Green, printer, the sum of fifty dollars, and Ezekiel Johnson, Doorkeeper, the sum of sixty dollars. Amounting as per detailed statement herewith submitted, to the sum of seven hundred eighty four dollars and sixty cents.
