Ordered, That Mr. N. Williams, Mr. MacCreery and Mr. L. Hollingsworth be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the support of Henry Leeke of Montgomery county; a bill entitled, an act authorising Levin Dirickson, late sheriff and collector of Worcester county to complete his election, severally passed by that house Dec. 9th, 1812; a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the district of Columbia to the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend a certain road in Harford county; a bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money to make a turnpike road from Frederick town to Harper's Ferry, and for other purposes; a bill entitled, an act authorising and directing the levy court of Harford county to assess and levy a sum of money for the erection of a room for the reception and safe keeping of criminals in said county, severally passed by that house Dec. 10th 1812; and the following resolutions:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 7, 1812.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay annually, to Henry Harris of Somerset county, (drummer to the third Maryland regiment) or his order, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a musician during his life, as a further remuneration for the services rendered his country, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
