

The bill entitled, an act for the relief and benefit of the representatives of William Emmitt, deceased, of Frederick county, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. N. Williams from the committee delivers a bill entitled, an act directing the manner in which justices of the peace qualify, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Ezekiel Waters, and the bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for opening a road from Western Port, on George's Creek to Savage River in Allegany county, were severally read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out a public road from M'Shan's or Taylor's Ferry, on the Potomac, to Crampton's Gap, on the South Mountain in Washington county; and the bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a lot of ground in Coxes' town, in Baltimore county, and to erect a building thereon, to be used as a school-house and meeting house, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish pilots and regulate their fees; a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and Chesapeake Bay; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of James Wilson, late of Somerset county deceased; a bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Queen Ann's county, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned; a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company under the name of the Managers and Directors of the Elkton Library Company; a bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Elijah Shay and Rose Shay of Somerset county, severally passed by that house, Dec. 14, 1812, and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 14, 1812,

Resolved, that the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto Moses Greer, late a private in the revolutionary war, or to his order annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private.

Which were severally read the first time and the bills and resolutions ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Jerome Bonaparte, King of Westphalia, and Elizabeth Bonaparte, of the city of Baltimore, endorsed, by the house of delegates, December 15, 1812, read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

*Amendments proposed.*

1st. Strike out the words "King of Westphalia," in the title.

2nd. Strike out the preamble.

3rd. Strike out the words "King of Westphalia," in the second line of the second page.

Which were severally read the first and second time, agreed to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

WEDNESDAY, December 16, 1812.

THE Senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as preclude the senate from making any amendment to a money bill. Ordered, that Messrs Brown, Stephen and Davis, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Peter A. Carnes, of St. Mary's county, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety six, entitled, an act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned; the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge, and the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Cecil county, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
