Amendment proposed.

In the sixth section after the words "Christiana Bridge" insert "keeping the now public road from Elk Landing, until it crosses Big Elk Creek and then."

Which was read the first and second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The amendments to the bill entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, were severally read the second time and disagreed to, except the first, second and last, which were agreed to.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act relating to the Governor and Council of this state.

Ordered, that Mr. Brown, Mr. N. Williams and Mr. Lloyd be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Queen Ann's county, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for taking special bail in actions of trespass *quare clausum fregit* and the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Talbot county, were severally read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Mary Still, Esther Still and Edith Still of Caroline county; the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out and open a road from the town of Westminster, in Frederick county to the city of Washington and George town, passed at November session eighteen hundred and three; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Robert Bruff; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Bullen of Talbot county; the bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Elijah Shay and Rose Shay of Somerset county; the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company in the city of Baltimore entitled, the United Hose and Suction Engine Company; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of George P. Stevenson, and the bill entitled, an act recognizing the coin of the United States, and the value of foreign coins, as established by the acts of the congress of the United States, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the House of Delegates by the clerk.

On motion, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to continue an act entitled, an act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and county of Baltimore, and the several supplements thereto.

Ordered, that Mr. N. Williams, Mr. Brown and Mr. MacCreery be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
