

Which were severally read the first time and the bills and resolutions ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act directing the manner in which justices of the peace shall qualify, and for other purposes, endorsed, by the house of delegates, Dec. 21, 1812, read the second time and will not pass. Also returns the bill entitled, an act to prevent the issuing of small bank notes, and the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to grant a public road and confirm the same in the upper part of Queen Ann's county, severally passed by that house Dec. 21, 1812. Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Messler and David Rinehart, trustees of James Fiquhar, of Frederick county; the bill entitled, an act to authorise and direct the sheriff of Montgomery county to execute a deed or deeds therein mentioned; the bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county, to remit part of the money paid by James Fletcher, for the materials of the old court house of said county; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Rachel Roberts, of the city of Annapolis, and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Fennell, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John Sample, of York county, Pennsylvania; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Franklin Lee Ridgely, and Richard Greenbury Ridgely, minors, and the bill entitled, an act authorising Richard Ruff, of Harford county, to make sale of the land therein mentioned, were severally read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a Masonic Hall in the city of Baltimore, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time, and will pass.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, December 22, 1812.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Thomas, (President,) who is indisposed. Mr. Davis was elected President pro tem. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a Masonic Hall in the city of Baltimore, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the council delivers a communication from the executive, covering a resolution of the legislature of the state of New Hampshire, ratifying an amendment to the constitution of the United States, inhibiting any citizen from receiving any title of nobility or honor; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

Mr. Stephen from the committee to whom was referred the petition of John R. E. Chesley, delivers a bill entitled, an act for the sale of the real estate of Thomas Chesley and Henrietta Chesley, late of Calvert county, deceased; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. N. Williams from the committee to whom was referred the petition of James Sloan, delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising James Sloan, senr. of the city of Baltimore, as attorney for Dr. Joseph Mackrill, to execute a deed to Dr. Edward Harris, for the lands therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the question was put, will the senate reconsider the resolution authorising a loan to the president and directors of the Potomac Company? Resolved in the affirmative.

The resolution being read, the question was put, will the senate assent thereto? Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution relative to noting the acts of assembly, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for founding an University in the city or precincts of Baltimore, by the name of the University of Maryland, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed.

- 1st. Strike out the word "professor," in the 9th line of the 7th page and insert "profession."
- 2nd. Alter the word "state," in the 4th line of the 10th page, insert "or which may be contained in any future act."
- 3rd. After the word "that," in the 7th line of the 11th page, insert "so much of."
- 4th. Strike out the word "on," in the 10th line of the 11th page, and insert "in."
- 5th. After the word "medicine" in the last line of the bill, insert "as is inconsistent with, repugnant to, or supplied by this act."

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland and for the extension of the charters of the several banks therein mentioned, and for other purposes, was read the second time, and will not pass.

The bill entitled, an act to continue an act entitled, an act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and county of Baltimore, and the several supplements thereto; the bill entitled, an act to extend the powers of the levy court of Talbot county and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Abraham Broom, of Talbot county, were severally read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for opening and extending Aisquith street in the Eastern precincts of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed.

- 1st. Strike out from the word "the" in the 12th line of the 3rd page, to the word "to," in the 12th line of the same page, and insert "register of the city of Baltimore."
- 2nd. In the 13th line of the 4th page, after the word "first," insert "tendered."
