The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Cambridge Academy, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety six, entitled, an act respecting the roads in Somerset and Worcester counties; a bill entitled, an additional supplement to a supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state; a bill entitled, an act to extend the same constitutional privileges to all persons conscientiously scrupulous of taking an oath, as are now enjoyed by the religious societies called Quakers, Menonists, Tunkers, Nicholites or New Quakers, and to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as are repugnant thereto; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of James Gouty and John Stevens Gouty, orphan children of Zachariah Gouty, late of Caroline county, deceased; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of George Michael Condat, of Frederick county; a bill entitled, an act to repeal so much of the laws of this state as requires property qualification in jurors; a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to direct descents; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of William Ringold, late of Kent county, deceased; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Alice Craycrof; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Patton, of Talbot county, severally passed by that house, Dec. 3, 1812; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Ann Matilda Hebb, an infant child of William Hebb, of Prince George's county; a bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Queen Ann's county; a bill entitled, an act to make public an old road leading from South River Church, to intersect the Annapolis road to West river; a bill entitled, an act to alter, change and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the division of Prince George's county into election districts; a bill entitled, an act to establish and confirm the falls turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to R'd. Caton's Lime Kiln; a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to change the name of Georgetown Cross Roads, in Kent county; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Margaret Lamb, of the city of Annapolis; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Andrew Porter Evans, purchaser of confiscated property; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the Presbyterian congregation of Queen Ann's and Caroline counties; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of John Burgoine; a bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of jurors in certain cases, and a bill entitled, an act for draining a branch or Swamp called Bee Tree Swamp, lying in Caroline county, severally passed by that house, Dec. 24, 1812; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act relating to the governor and council of this state; the bill entitled, an act for the improvement of the Baltimore theatre; the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Fennell, severally passed by that house, Dec. 23, 1812; and the bill entitled, an act to alter the time of holding Baltimore county court, passed by that house, Dec. 4, 1812. Ordered to be engrossed. Also returns the bill entitled, an act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as preclude the senate from making any amendment to a money bill, endorsed, by the house of delegates, Dec. 23, 1812, read the second time and will not pass.

Mr. Lloyd from the committee of conference delivers the following report, viz :

The committee of conference to whom were referred the bill entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, and the several amendments thereto, report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and are of opinion that justice and policy suggest the propriety that the minority in each county in the state should be represented at the board of commissioners of the tax; and with a view of making the bill now under consideration, conformable to the above principles, it is recommended by the committee of conference, that the bill should be sent to the house of delegates for reconsideration.

The resolution relative to the levy court of Baltimore county, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out a road from William Sinclair's plantation to Vaughan's Mine Run and Gunpowder Mills, and from thence to the Owl Branch, and the bill entitled, an act to correct a mistake in the record therein mentioned, were severally read the second time by special order, and will pass.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to a supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, was read the second time by special order, and will pass with the proposed amendment.
