The bill entitled, an act for the benefit and relief of William Harrison, (of James,) of Talbot county, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at or near Rock Run, and the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to change the name of Georgetown Cross Roads, in Kent county, were severally read the second time by special order, and will pass.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to revive, amend and continue an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the line of the district of Columbia where it crosses the post road leading from Georgetown to Frederick town, through Montgomery and Frederick counties to Frederick town; a bill entitled, an act for the support of William M. Chancy of Anne Arundel county; a bill entitled, an act authorising an appropriation for the Penitentiary of this state, severally passed by that house Dec. 24th 1812; And the following resolutions:

Resolved, That the governor of this state be, and he is hereby requested to address in the name of the state of Maryland, letters to the following named officers of the navy of the United States, expressive of the very high sense entertained of the intrepidity, gallantry, good conduct and services of themselves and crews in the several engagements with the enemy, in which they supereminently distinguished themselves. To captain Hull and lieutenant Morris, late of the United States Frigate Constitution, in the attack, defeat and capture of the British frigate "Guerriere," unprecedented in the annals of naval history; to captain Jones and lieutenants Biddle and Rogers of the late United States sloop of war Wasp, in the capture of the British sloop of war "Frolic" of superior force; to captain DeCatur of the United States' frigate United States, in the victory obtained over and capture of the British frigate "Macedonian."

"And be it enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Orphans' Court of Calvert county to allow the said trustee such commission as they may think proper upon the amount of sales to be paid upon the final completion of the trust, which said commission shall be exclusive of all necessary expenses except personal expences."
