SATURDAY, December 26, 1812.

The same members appeared as on Thursday except Mr. Frazier, Mr. Lloyd and Mr. Tabbs.

The members present adjourn until Monday morning 9 o'clock.

MONDAY, December 28, 1812.

The same members appeared as on Saturday. Mr. Frazier and Mr. N. Williams appeared in the senate. The proceedings from Thursday inclusive, were read.

The bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of jurors in certain cases; the bill entitled, an act to encourage the education of youth in Worcester county; the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to change the name of George town Cross Roads in Kent county; and the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at or near Rock Run, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of James Hood of John, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to alter change and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government which relate to the time and manner of electing the senate of this state, and the manner of filling up vacancies in that body, was read the second time and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The amendment to the bill entitled, an act for the sale of the real estate of Thomas Chesley and Hettta Chesley, late of Calvert county deceased, was read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish pilots and regulate their fees was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of Delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to establish and confirm the Fall's turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Richard Caton's Lime Kiln, and the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Baltimore county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of John Burgoine, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising James Sloan senior of the city of Baltimore, as attorney for Doctor Joseph Mackrill, to execute a deed to Edward Harris for the lands therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called "The City Bank of Baltimore," passed by that house Dec. 25th, 1812; a bill entitled, an act to lay out a road in Baltimore county; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Debby Ann M'Coy, an infant of Anne Arundel county, severally passed by that house Dec. 26, 1812; a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Baruch Fowler of Anne Arundel county to convey and to receive a conveyance of certain land therein mentioned, passed by that house Dec. 28th, 1812; and the following resolutions:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 24, 1812.

Resolved, that the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Sedgwick James of Harford county, or to his order, the sum of forty two dollars, it being the amount of the composition money paid by him into the treasury, on part of a tract of land called "the Hunting Ground" lying and being in Harford county aforesaid, the said part lying foul of an elder tract called "Hutchinson's Discovery Corrected."

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 23, 1812.

Resolved, that the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Samuel Moale of Baltimore county, trustee to Mark Alexander, deceased, or his order, the sum of eighty one pounds four shillings and two pence, being the same money heretofore deposited in the Western Shore treasury by the said Mark Alexander, for the payment of a British debt which has since been received by the creditors, Christopher Court and Mildred and Roberts, to whom it was due by due course of law, upon the said Samuel Moale giving bond with security to the state, to be approved of by the said treasurer to refund the aforesaid sum of money and interest, in case a certificate shall at any time be produced to the treasurer, acknowledging that on the seventeenth day of May, in the year seventeen hundred and eighty one, Mark Alexander paid into the treasury for Christopher Court, the sum of forty eight pounds, six shillings and eight pence, and for Mildred and Roberts thirty two pounds seventeen shillings and six pence, by virtue of an act of assembly passed at October session seventeen hundred and eighty, entitled, an act for calling out of circulation the quota of the state of the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly under the old government and by the resolves of convention.
