FRIDAY, *January 1, 1813.*

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery for the use and benefit of the Washington Free School in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time by special order and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of John Norris of Harford county, was read the second time by special order, dissented from, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Smith and others of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the removal of certain proceedings against general Henry Lee of the city of Alexandria from the county court of Baltimore county to the county court of Montgomery county, and for other purposes, was read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Henry King, was read the second time by special order and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising Robert Welch of Ben. former collector of Anne Arundel county to complete his collection, and a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a Fire Engine in Cumberland, in Allegany county, were severally read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to direct descents, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of John Sullivan, was read the second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and mi-demeanors in the city and county of Baltimore, passed by that house Dec. 31, 1812; a bill entitled, an act to pay the civil list and other expences of civil government; a bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed from Thomas W. Caulk to Lambert Veazey for a tract of land called Wheeler's Point, lying in Cecil county and to confirm to Thomas Marsh Forman his title to said land, severally passed by that house Jan. 1st, 1813; the following resolutions :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 1, 1813.

Whereas, a resolution passed the legislature on the fifteenth day of December eighteen hundred and twelve, authorising the treasurer of the Western Shore to loan thirty thousand dollars of the six per cent stock of the United States, to the president and directors of the Potomac Company, upon their pledging the funds of said company : *And Whereas*, upon examination of the law incorporating said company and the various supplements thereto, there is no power vested in said company to make such pledge, *Therefore*

Resolved, That so much of the said resolution as requires the president and directors to pledge the funds of said corporation be, and the same is hereby repealed and made null and void.
