*Whereas*, it appears from the report of the committee appointed to enquire into the state of the records of the court of chancery, that but few of the papers were recorded for a considerable time preceding the death of Samuel H. Howard, and none since the appointment of Nicholas Brewer, the present register, and it appears it has been the invariable custom after decrees, to charge suitors with fees of recording.
