So it was resolved in the affirmative, and the message sent to the senate.

Mr. Potter delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Caroline county, praying the incorporation of a company under the name and style of the Caroline Manufacturing Company; which was read, and on motion by Mr. Potter, the question was put, that the same be referred to a committee.—Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Potts, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to authorise the removal of the public records of the Western Shore to Frederick town in Frederick county, and for other purposes. *Ordered*, that Messrs. Potts, Bowles and Plater be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Francis M. Hall, Esquire, a delegate from Prince George's county, appeared and took his seat in the house.

On motion by Mr. Lecompte, *Ordered*, that so much of his excellency the governor's message as relates to the correspondence with the general government relative to the duty of the national government to provide for the defence of each state, and the necessity of further provision for the defence of this state, be referred to Messrs. Lecompte, Kilgour and Barney to consider and report thereon.

That so much thereof as relates to the pay and rations of the militia of the state which have been called into service by virtue of the powers with which the officers of the militia are invested, also such parts thereof as relate to the propriety of authorising by law the appointment of officers to keep regular accounts of the expences to which the state may be subjected in defending itself, be referred to Messrs. Dorsey, Wilson and Bowles, to consider and report thereon.

And that so much thereof as relates to the authorising by law the organization of volunteer companies of mounted infantry, be referred to Messrs. Plater, Potter and Belt, to consider and report thereon.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, that leave be given to bring in a bill entitled, an act compelling exempts from militia duty possessing assessable property to the amount therein mentioned, to find substitutes in certain cases. Resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That Messrs. Dorsey, Emerson and Warner be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Lewis, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes. *Ordered*, that Messrs. Lewis, Bowles and Sprigg be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The house adjourns until to morrow morning 9 o'clock.

And the following resolution :

BY THE SENATE, May 18, 1813.

Whereas, it appears from the communication of the treasurer of the Western Shore, that William Marbury, late agent of the state of Maryland, has not complied with the resolution of November session 1812, directing the said William Marbury to transfer to Benjamin Harwood, trustee, all the old six per cent and deferred and three per cent stocks now standing in his name, belonging to the state.

Therefore, Resolved, that Benjamin Harwood, trustee and treasurer of the state of Maryland, be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to take such steps forthwith, as the attorney general of the state of Maryland may advise, to compel the said William Marbury to transfer to him the said treasurer and trustee all the stock standing in his name, the property of the state of Maryland
