The senate met.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth from the committee delivers a bill entitled, an act for the building of barges for the defence of the Chesapeake Bay; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising Thomas Ennals, late sheriff of Dorchester county to complete his collections; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of William Davis, late of Worcester county deceased, severally passed by that house May 26th, 1813; And, the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, May 26, 1813.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Hezekiah Carr, late a drummer in the Maryland line, or to his order, a sum of money in quarterly payments, equal to the half pay of a drummer during his life.

which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also returns the resolution relative to the transfer of the stocks of the state now standing in the name of William Marbury late agent, endorsed by the house of delegates May 26, 1813; read the second time and assented to with the proposed amendment.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out the word "and" in the last line of the first page, and insert in lieu thereof "again to call upon the said William Marbury to comply with the said resolution, and upon his omitting to do so when he is hereby" Which was read and agreed to.

Also delivers a communication from William Marbury upon the subject of the foregoing resolution, which being deemed of a confidential nature, was read with closed doors.

The following resolutions were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Resolved, that from and after the present session of assembly, no private act, nor any bill for laying out any new road, or for altering or extending any old road in this state, shall pass the legislature upon any petition or application whatever, if of a private or personal nature, unless notice be given by the petitioner or applicant in some newspaper printed in the county where the petitioner or applicant resides, or in the county where the road proposed will run, if respecting a road, provided there be a newspaper published in that county, then in some newspaper printed in the city of Baltimore, city of Annapolis, Frederick town, Hager's town, District of Columbia or Easton; for four successive weeks, or by advertisement set up at the court house door of the county where such petitioner or applicant resides, at least four weeks before and within three months of the time when such petition or application shall be presented or made to the general assembly, that a petition is intended to be preferred, mentioning in such notice the substance of such petition; and the petitioner or applicant shall produce evidence of such notice to the general assembly at the time of hearing such petition.

Resolved, that the executive of this state, in order to give publicity to the above resolution, cause the same to be published in all the newspapers published in this state, and in such others as they may think best calculated for that purpose.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of William Davis, late of Worcester county, deceased, was read the second time by special order, and will not pass.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas B. Briscoe of St. Mary's county, was read the second time by special order and the question put, shall this bill pass?

The resolution relative to the boundaries between the first and third divisions of Maryland militia, was read the second time by special order, and dissented from.

The resolution in favor of Hezekiah Carr, was read the second time by special order and assented to.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to repeal all such parts of the 6th section of the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, passed at November session in the year eighteen hundred and eleven, as authorises and empowers a commanding officer of a regiment, battalion or extra battalion to order out militia in cases of invasion or threatened invasion, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
