

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment of the militia which has been called into active service, and expences incurred by reason thereof, was read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising Thomas Ennalls, late sheriff of Dorchester county, to complete his collections, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit and relief of William Harrison, (of James,) of Talbot county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of Joshua Tagart, Samuel Hopkins and Thomas Parrott, of Talbot county, was read the second time, dissented from and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, the question was put, will the senate reconsider the resolution relative to the boundaries between the first and third divisions of Maryland militia? Resolved in the affirmative.

The resolution being read, the question was put, will the senate assent thereto, with the proposed amendments.

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

1st. "Strike out the preamble."

2nd. Strike out from the word "that" in the 1st line of the resolution, to the end thereof, and insert "the governor be and he is hereby authorised and requested to take such steps as to him may seem meet, to ascertain the true boundaries of the first and third divisions of the Maryland militia, and when so ascertained, and fixed by his decision, to cause the same to be recorded in the adjutant general's office of this state, as the proper and true boundary; and all fines and drafts which have heretofore been imposed or made, not conformable to the boundaries to be thus established, the governor be and he is hereby authorised to remit and release." Resolved in the affirmative and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth from the committee, delivers a bill entitled, an act relating to lunatics, idiots and persons insane; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Brown asked and obtained leave of absence for Mr. Tabbs, for the remainder of the session.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts; a bill entitled, an act providing for the calling out and detaching the militia of this state, and for other purposes, severally passed by that house, May 28, 1813; a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Montgomery county, to appoint a constable for the town of Brookville, in said county, passed by that house May 29, 1813; and the following resolution-

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, May 28, 1813.

The secretary of war of the United States having required of the governor of this state, that a detachment of the drafted militia under the law of congress, should be ordered out for the defence of the cities of Baltimore and Annapolis, whereby considerable expences were created for the maintenance and transportation of the said detachments to their respective places of rendezvous, which expences ought to be promptly paid: *Therefore,*

Resolved, that the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorised to draw on the treasury of the Western Shore for the payment of all such accounts as they may deem just and proper, and that they be requested to transmit a statement of such accounts to the department of war of the United States.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act for building of barges for the defence of the Chesapeake bay, endorsed, will not pass. Also delivers the engrossed bills from No 1 to No 9 inclusive, severally assented to by that house May 29, 1813; which were severally read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the speedy conveyance of public letters, and for other purposes, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in this state, and for other purposes, was read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution relative to the transmission of the votes and proceedings of November session, 1812, to the sheriffs of the several counties of this state, was read the second time by special order, dissented from and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, was read the second time by special order, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to make a turnpike road from the district of Columbia to the city of Baltimore, and the bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Montgomery county to appoint a constable for the town of Brookville in said county, were severally read the second time by special order, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. The senate adjourns until 3 o'clock, P. M.
