The bill entitled, an act providing for the calling out and detaching the militia of this state and for other purposes, was read the second time by special order, and the question put, shall this bill pass with the proposed amendment?

The clerk of the house of delegates returns the bill entitled, an act relating to lunatics, idiots and persons insane, passed by that house, May 29, 1813; ordered to be engrossed. Also delivers a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, passed by that house, May 29, 1813; which was read the first and second time by special order, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. Also delivers the following resolution.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, May 29, 1813.

RESOLVED, that a sum not exceeding one hundred and eighty thousand dollars be appropriated for the purchase of arms, ordinance and military stores, under the direction of the governor and council, and to be paid to the order of the governor, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury of the Western Shore.

RESOLVED, that the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised to negotiate a loan on such terms and at such periods as the governor and council shall approve, not exceeding the sum of four hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and the faith of the state is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal and interest thereof, provided always, that in no case shall a larger rate of interest be contracted to be paid than six per centum per annum.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. Also delivers the following resolutions.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, May 29, 1813.

RESOLVED, as the opinion of this general assembly, that the state of Maryland is entitled to a fair contribution of the national means for its protection, and that the refusal of the executive of the United States to assume the liquidation of the claims arising from the employment of the militia of this state, in the same manner that they have liquidated those of Virginia for the employment of the militia of that state, is partial, unjust, and contrary to the spirit of our constitution, and if such refusal shall be persisted in, and the war should be protracted, with the diminished means and increased burthens incidental to such a state of things, must exhaust the resources of our state, and eventuate in a system of taxation burthensome to our constituents.

RESOLVED, that our senators and representatives in congress be instructed and required to use every possible exertion to cause the monies expended by the state in consequence of the recent operations of the enemy, to be refunded to this state from the treasury of the United States.

RESOLVED, that the governor and council be requested to forward to our senators and representatives in congress a copy of the preceding resolutions, accompanied with copies of the official correspondence communicated to the general assembly of Maryland at the present session, by his excellency the governor.
