THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Hands delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Kent county, praying that a road in said county called the Quaker road may be opened and made public; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hands, Jervis Spencer and Boyer.

Which was read the first and second time by special order and concurred in.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from Alexander M'Connell, of Baltimore county, praying a special act of insolvency, which was read and referred to Messrs. Harryman, Warner and Randall.

Mr. Hogg delivers a petition from James Galbraith, of Cæcil county, praying that his title to certain lands may be confirmed ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hogg, Robert Evans and Lusby.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Juliana Coch, of the city of Baltimore, praying a divorce ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Warner and Stansbury.

Mr. Cottman delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Somerset county, praying the establishment of a Bank at Princes Ann in said county ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Cottman, Bayly and Long.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of the eastern precincts of Baltimore, praying for a supplement to the act passed at November session 1812, for opening and extending Aisquith street ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Harryman, Warner and Randall.

Mr. Blackiston delivers a bill entitled an act, to repeal an act entitled, an act to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein ment oned, so far as relates to Saint Mary's and Harford counties ; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Francis M. Hall delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Ann Gentle, Sylvester Hunt and Allen Derner, of Prince George's county ; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Maulsby delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Rhea, of Harford county ; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Wilson from the committee of elections and privileges, delivers the following report :

The committee of elections and privileges beg leave specially to report on the case of the contested election of Allegany county. It appears to the committee that Allegany county is divided into six election districts, and that six attending judges at the close of the election in said districts, assembled at the usual place of the sitting of the county court of the said county, for the purpose of making their return as prescribed by law—That four of the said judges thus assembled, being a majority of the whole number, have made their return, (marked No. 1) declaring that William Hilleary, George Robinett of Nathan, George M. Culloh and Beal Howard, had the greatest number of legal votes, and are therefore duly elected delegates of Allegany county, to the General Assembly of Maryland.

The committee consider that the return signed by the majority of the judges, is a valid return under the circumstances attendant on the face of both returns, because it does appear
