

The bill for the relief of Margaret Griffith, of Frederick-Town, in Frederick county. The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out a road from William Sinclair's plantation to Vaughan's mine run and Gunpowder Mills, and from thence to the Owl Branch, passed at November session 1802; the bill for the relief of John Westfall, of Frederick county; the bill for the benefit of Charles Dashiell, (of Charles,) of Worcester county; the bill for the relief of Margaret Miller; the bill for the relief of Henry W. Magruder, of Prince George's county; and the bill to incorporate the Buckingham Academy in Worcester county, were sent to the senate.

The speaker laid before the house a report of the clerk of Baltimore county court, relative to the attendance of the judges; which was read and referred to the Committee of Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from the Bible Society of Baltimore, praying an act of incorporation; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Tilghman and Emory. Also a petition from sundry merchants of the city of Baltimore, praying an act to incorporate the Universal Insurance Company; and a petition from sundry merchants of the city of Baltimore, in relation to the Patapsco Insurance Company; which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Barney, and Warner.

Mr. Maulsby delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying a review of part of the road from Peach Bottom, to Baltimore; which was read and referred to Messrs. Maulsby, Forwood, (of Wm) and Dallam.

Mr. Howard delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of John Kimes, late of Allegany county; which was read.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a memorial from sundry inhabitants of the city of Baltimore, respecting the public wharves in said city; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Tilghman and Plater.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from the St. Andrews Society, of the city of Baltimore, praying an act of incorporation; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Barney and Randall. Also a petition from Samuel M'Kean, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Warner and Barney.

Mr. Belt delivers a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-arundel county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of John Harman, his wife, and their three children; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Caspar O. Muller, and a petition from Henry E. Bayley, both of the city of Baltimore, praying special acts of insolvency; which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Barney and Randall.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill entitled, an act to open a road from John Cain's tavern to Berlin in Frederick county, passed by the senate Dec. 20, which was read; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John Fossett, of Worcester county; and the bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Kent county. Severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of James Galbraith, of Cecil county, endorsed, "will pass, with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read; and a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Benjamin Murrow, of Allegany county, passed by the senate Dec. 20; which was read.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from James Spelman, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Warner and Stansbury. Also a petition from William Roberdean Smith, of the city of Baltimore, praying that the name of Roberdean, which he has used for several years past, although not his name of baptism may be confirmed to him; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Randall and Stansbury. And a petition from Walter Simpson, senr. and Walter Simpson, junr. of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Randall and Stansbury.

Mr. Long delivers a petition from James Hewitt, an old soldier; which was read and referred to the standing committee on soldier's petitions.

Mr. Kilgour delivers a petition from Henry Howard, (of John) of Montgomery county, praying that he may be authorised to bring a certain negro from Virginia into this state; which was read and referred to Messrs. Kilgour, Jones and Crabb.

Mr. Long delivers a bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Thomas Robertson, and Kitturah Robertson, of Somerset county; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. John H. Thomas, delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Downey, of Frederick county; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed. Mr. Kilgour delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Henry Howard, (of John) of Montgomery county; which was read.

Mr. Williams delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth Christopher, of Worcester county; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. John H. Thomas delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Dennis Kennedy, of Frederick county; which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for founding an academy at Hagerstown, in Washington county; was read the second time passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Alexander M'Connell, of Baltimore county; was read the second time and passed.
