TUESDAY, January 18, 1814.

The House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

*Mr. Barney* delivers a petition from *Charles Herstons*, of Baltimore county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read.

The bill for the relief of *Thomas Batt*; the bill for the relief of *Caleb Boyle*; the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the better regulation of apprentices; and the message relating to the appointment of bank directors were sent to the senate.

*Mr. Dorsey* delivers a petition from *Henry Hammond*, and others of Anne Arundel county, praying that a law may pass to authorise the sale of the real estate of *William Hammond*, deceased; which was read and referred to *Messrs. Dorsey, Sellman* and *Belt*.

*Mr. Potter* delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Caroline county, praying the incorporation of a company under the name and style of the Caroline Manufacturing Company; which was read and referred to *Messrs. Potter, Culbreth* and *Saulsbury*.

Also a petition from *Susan Rouse*, of Caroline county, praying that the levy court may be authorised to levy a sum of money for her support; which was read and referred to *Messrs. Potter, Culbreth* and *Willis*.

The report on the petition of *George Gale*, of Cecil county, was read the second time by special order, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

*Mr. Randall* from the committee delivers the following report :

The committee to whom was referred the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying for a division of said county, have taken the same into their serious consideration, and find that public notice has not been given that such an application would be made to this legislature, and consequently a great number of the citizens of the county, could not have had any knowledge that such an application would be made. They are of opinion that a subject so important in its nature and consequences, ought to be generally known through the county, before it is finally acted upon by the legislature. They therefore recommend that it be referred to the next General Assembly of Maryland.
