Mr. Stonestreet delivers a petition from Elizabeth Briscoe, of Charles county, praying that cer tain real property belonging to her infint children may be sold; which was read and referred to

Messrs. Stonestreet, Ford and Parnham.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Charles Carroles, and Ruth Carroles, of Baltimore county; Mr. Willis a bill entitled, an act authorising Thomas Saul bury late sheriff and collector of Caroline county to complete his collections; and Mr. Howard bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the charters of Baltimore, and for other purposes; which were severally read.
