

SATURDAY, January 22, 1814.

THE house met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant heirs of Henry Brook; the bill for the relief of Fielder Moore, were sent to the senate; the engrossed bills No. 1 to 50 inclusive, were read assented to and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of the right of cutting a mill race through the land of Richard Simpser, a minor, in Cecil county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. The resolution in favor of Richard Waters, endorsed, "dissented from" and the following message.

BY THE SENATE, January 21, 1814.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

We have rejected the resolution in favor of Richard Waters, it being one of that description which the senate cannot alter or amend. But if a bill or resolution shall originate in your house authorising and empowering the governor and council to settle the accounts of said Waters, and to receive and have secured, or otherwise disposed of in their discretion all such blankets and shirts as are therein mentioned, and to draw an order on the treasurer for payment to said Waters, for such sum, if any, as may appear to be due to him unless the general government shall have made provision for paying the same, it will meet the concurrence of the senate.

Also a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to open and extend Pratt street in the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore, to the District of Columbia, towards the city of Washington; and a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for making an artificial road by the best and nearest route from the Philadelphia and Lancaster turnpike road through the village of Strasburg in Lancaster county, to the Susquehanna Bridge at M'Calls ferry, and from thence to the city of Baltimore; which were severally read.

Mr. Tilghman delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Washington county, praying a road from Williamsport, in a northerly direction to the Pennsylvania line; which was read and referred to Messrs. Tilghman, Kershner and Gabby.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from Thomas Ryan, and others of the city of Baltimore, praying that certain property belonging to Alexander B. Hanna an infant, may be sold; which was read and referred to Messrs. Randall, Warner and Donaldson.

Mr. Maulsby delivers a petition from Philip Chamberlain, of Harford county, praying that a law may pass to authorise the recording of a deed therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Maulsby, Forwood (of Wm.) and Forwood, (of Jb.)

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, leave given to bring in a bill for turnpiking a road from Baltimore to Belle Air, and thence to the scite fixed upon for a bridge over the river Susquehanna, near Rock run. Ordered, That Messrs. Maulsby, Dallam and Forwood, (of Wm.) be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Bennett, leave given to bring in a bill to incorporate a Charitable Society in the town of Easton. Ordered, That Messrs. Bennett, Martin and Jonathan Spencer be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Howard, Ordered, That the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in this state, and for other purposes, be made the order of the day for Tuesday next.

Mr. Duvall delivers a petition from Robert Welch, (of Ben.) collector of Anne-Arundel county, praying that he may be authorised to complete his collections; which was read and referred to Messrs. Duvall, Sellman and Claude.

On motion by Mr. Cottman, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Elijah S. Smith, of Somerset county. Ordered, That Messrs. Cottman, Bayly and Long be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Bayly, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act authorising Matthias Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of Somerset county, to complete his collection. Ordered, That Messrs. Bayly, Cottman and Long be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Stonestreet delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of Gerard Briscoe, late of Charles county deceased; Mr. Reynolds a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Sarah B. Parker, of Calvert county; Mr. Claude a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Susan O'Harra, of Anne-Arundel county. Mr. Potter a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company under the name and style of the Caroline Manufacturing Company; Mr. Barney a bill entitled, an act to authorise the raising a sum of money by a lottery or lotteries to build an arsenal for the city of Baltimore; Mr. Bayly a bill entitled, an act authorising Matthias Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of Somerset county to complete his collections; and Mr. Cottman a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Elijah S. Smith, of Somerset county; which were severally read.

The bill entitled, an act to enable the president, directors and company, of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland at Annapolis, and of the branch bank at Easton, to remove said banks in case of necessity, and for other purposes; was read the second time and passed.
