The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Jesse Jarret, Henry Scarif and others; was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of Gerard Briscoe, late of Charles county deceased; the bill to authorise the raising a sum of money by a lottery or lotteries to build an arsenal for the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes; and the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia, towards the city of Washington, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Blake delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Wm. R. Sewall, of Calvert county; which was read the first and second time by special order, and the question put, shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nicholas Hall, of Frederick county, and the amendments proposed to the bill entitled, an act for the preservation of young shad fish in the river Susquehanna, were severally read the second time, assented to and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an act to appoint Samuel Ogle, trustee for the sale of the real estate of Joseph Ogle deceased, of Frederick county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Rebecca Hopkins, of Caroline county, was read the second time and the question put, shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Jerusalem Church in Frederick county, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Hatfield Wright, of Caroline county; and the bill entitled, an act to defray the expenses incurred in the trial of criminal prosecutions removed from one county of this state to another; severally endorsed, "will not pass." And the bill entitled, an act declaring the river Susquehanna to be a highway, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read; also the resolution in favor of George Gale, of Cecil county, endorsed dissented from and the following resolution:

BY THE SENATE, January 24th, 1814.

Whereas it is represented to this General Assembly, by the petition of George Gale, of Cecil county, that the resolution which passed in his behalf at November session 1800, erroneously stated the date of the deed therein mentioned, from a certain John Ryan to said Gale, to be the first of December 1795, instead of the 31st of December 1795, and which deed conveyed a part of a tract of land called New Connaught Manor, whereby the said George Gale cannot derive a benefit intended to have been extended to him, *Therefore*

*Resolved*, That the chancellor be, and he is hereby authorised to issue or cause to be issued, a patent for a part of New Connaught Manor, lying in Cecil county, to and in favor of George Gale of Cecil county, in the manner and on the terms provided by the said resolution, without requiring a new survey to be made of said land, and as if the deed from John Ryan to said Gale had been truly recited in the resolution aforesaid.

On motion by Mr. Howard, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons. Ordered, That Messrs Howard, Maulsby and M'Culloh be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the following order was read: *Ordered*, That the honorable the executive council be, and are hereby requested to lay before this house all their proceedings, touching the appointment of armourers for the year 1813, likewise the accounts and claims of the said armourers, together with reports of the present situation of the several armouries of this state; to whom arms have been delivered; how many and of what kind, and how many and of what kind remain in store.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for transcribing certain wills, and a book of inventories in the register's office of Saint Mary's county, was read the second time and passed.

The house adjourns until to morrow morning nine o'clock.

TUESDAY, January 25, 1814.

THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled an act to authorise the administrators of Thomas Contee Bowie, late of Prince George's county, deceased, to sell and convey certain real property therein mentioned; the bill entitled, an act authorising Robert Welch, of Ben. collector of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collection; and the bill entitled, a supplement to an act to authorise Matthias Shaaffner, late sheriff of Washington county, to complete his collections, passed at the present session of assembly, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. John Thomas, the following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the senate together with the bill to which it relates.
