

Be it resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised, to negotiate a loan, on such terms and at such periods, as the governor and council shall approve, not exceeding the sum of _____ dollars, and the faith of the state is hereby pledged for the repayment of the principal and interest thereof.

On motion by *Mr. Crabb* leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Crabb, Millard and S. Stevens be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, an act to straighten the road from the city of Baltimore to Goodwin and Ridgeley's mills, on the falls of Great Gunpowder; the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons; and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Philip German, Junr. of the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a bill entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Ann Matilda Hebb, an infant child of William Hebb, of Prince George's county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant son of Andrew Hanna deceased, of the city of Baltimore; was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.
