

MONDAY, December 13, 1813.

THE senate met.—Present the same members as on Saturday.—The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth and Mr. Lloyd appeared in the senate.

Mr. Moses Tabbs appeared in the senate, qualified and took his seat.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following message :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Monday Dec. 13, 1813.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

The constitution and form of government having directed that the governor of this state shall be chosen on the second Monday of December in each and every year, and this being the day prescribed, we propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, to proceed to elect the governor of this state at 12 o'clock today. Levin Winder, Esq. is put in nomination by this house, and we have appointed Messrs J. H. Thomas and Mason to join such gentlemen as may be named by you to count the ballots and report thereon.

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Lloyd, *Resolved*, That the said message be referred to a special committee. Ordered, That Messrs. Stephen, N. Williams, Tabbs, Lloyd and Brown be the said committee.

Mr. Stephen from the committee to whom was referred the message from the house of delegates proposing to go into the election of governor, delivers the following report :

The committee to whom was referred the communication from the house of delegates relative to the election of a governor, report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and are of opinion that the senate proceed to the election of a governor.

POST MERIDIEM 4 o'clock.

The senate met. The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

BY THE SENATE, Dec. 13, 1813.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

We agree to proceed to the election of governor immediately. Robert Bowie is put in nomination by the senate. We have appointed Mr. Tabbs and Mr. Fenwick, to act in conjunction with the gentlemen proposed by your house to examine the ballots.

Mr. MacCreery asked and obtained leave of absence for Mr. N. Williams from to-morrow until Saturday next.

On motion of Mr. Tabbs leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to prevent negligencies and abuses in office of the judges of election. Ordered, That Messrs. Tabbs, J. Williams and W. Hollingsworth be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The senate having previously qualified agreeably to the constitution and form of government, proceeded to the election of a governor, the ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up and delivered to the committee of the senate, appointed to meet the committee of the house of delegates, who retired to the conference room and after some time returned and reported that Levin Winder had forty-eight votes, and Robert Bowie twenty-eight votes. *Whereupon* it is declared in the senate, that Levin Winder is elected governor of Maryland.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, December 14, 1813.

The Senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. N. Williams.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following message :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Dec. 14, 1813.

The honorable Levin Winder, having been elected governor of the state of Maryland, we have appointed Mr. J. H. Thomas, and Mr. Dorsey, jointly with such gentlemen as shall be named by your house, to wait upon the governor and request his attendance in the senate room to qualify according to the constitution and form of government.
