Which were severally read the first time and the bills and resolutions ordered to lie on the table. The bill entitled, an act to lay out and open two roads in Queen Ann's county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Rachel Ranans of Dorchester county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates a bill entitled, an act to lay out and make a public road in Worcester county; a bill entitled, an act authorising John Newton late sheriff and collector of Dorchester county to complete his collections; a bill entitled, an act authorising the drawing of a lottery or lotteries for the benefit of the University of Maryland; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Brock Case of Montgomery county; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Wm. Wheeler Junr. a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Alexander Malcum, infant child of Alexander Malcum, dec. of Caroline county; a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for opening and extending Aisquith street in the eastern precincts of Baltimore; a bill entitled, an act to authorise Gustavus Robert Alexander Brown, and Caroline his wife of Prince William county in the state of Virginia, to convey certain property in the precincts of Baltimore city, in Baltimore county, severally passed by that house Janr. 5, 1814; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Janr. 5, 1814.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to examine into the accounts of Thomas Baily, formerly sheriff of Baltimore county, with the state of Maryland, and to make allowances of such other and further credits as he the said Thomas Baily shall satisfy him ought to be admitted, over and above the credits allowed on the judgments rendered against the said Thomas Baily and his securities John Murray and Josias Stevenson in Baltimore county court, which bear date on the twenty first day of November, in the year eighteen hundred and eleven; and that the said treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to release on behalf of the state, by instrument under his hand and seal, the said John Murray and Josias Stevenson from the judgments aforesaid, on the payment by them of the principal sum of money so ascertained to be due, with an interest of six per cent thereon and costs of suits, within six months after the amount shall have been so adjusted: *Provided*, the said adjustment shall be made within three months from and after the passage of this resolution.

THURSDAY, January 6, 1814.

The senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Frazier appeared in the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Insurance Company, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed.

1st. Strike out from the word "directors" in the 8th line of the 3rd page to the second "the" in the 9th line of the same page, and insert "on or" before the tenth day of March next."

2nd. At the end of the 1st line of the 5th page add "such."

3rd. Strike out from the word "banks" in the 14th line of the 7th page, to the end of the section.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising and empowering the levy court of Calvert county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Wenman Ramsey, passed by that house Janr. 5, 1814; a bill entitled, an act to empower the levy court of Worcester county to lay off and appropriate part of the Warehouse Lot in New-Town as a public street; a bill entitled, an act making a public landing place in Somerset county; and a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Walter Muschett of the city of Baltimore, severally passed by that house Janr. 6, 1814; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Benjamin Murrow of Allegany county; and the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Chesapeake Insurance Company, severally passed by that house Janr. 5, 1814. Ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Hebb from the committee delivers a bill entitled, an act relating to the supervisors and overseers of the public roads in the several counties in this state; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Hawkins leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of certain persons who emigrated into or settled in this state before the adoption of the constitution of the United States. Ordered, That Messrs. Hawkins, N. Williams and Brown be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the election districts in Worcester county, was read the second time and will pass.

The bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Conococheague Bank in Williamsport in Washington county, was read the second time, and the question put, shall this bill pass with the proposed amendments?
