

Amendments proposed.

1st. Strike out the 9th enacting clause and insert "And be it enacted, that when this state shall become a stockholder to the amount of twenty thousand dollars it shall be entitled to appoint two directors, one to be chosen by the senate, and the other by the house of delegates, which state directors shall only be entitled to hold their seats for one year after their appointment unless re-elected."

2nd. Strike out the word "twenty" in the 14th line of the 15th page, and insert "fifty."

3rd. After the word "payable" in the 7th line of the 19th page, insert "to the said bank."

4th. At the end of the 19th rule add "provided that it shall not be lawful for said bank to issue notes of a less denomination than five dollars."

THE Senate met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act for altering the time of the meeting of the commissioners of the tax in Frederick county; the bill entitled, an act relating to the election districts in Worcester county; the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Insurance Company; and the bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Conococheague Bank in Williamsport in Washington county, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the better regulation of apprentices. Ordered That Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, Brown and Fenwick, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Wm. Wheeler Junr. was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Brock Case of Montgomery county, was read the second time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Strike out the preamble.

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at November session eighteen hundred and eleven, entitled, an act authorising Elizabeth Lockett of Frederick county to remove certain negroes into the state of Maryland, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed.

At the end of the bill add "provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to interfere with or affect the rights of any person or persons acquired before the passage of this act."

The report of the committee on the bill entitled, an act to give validity and operation to a deed of conveyance therein mentioned, was read the second time and unanimously concurred in.

The bill was then read the second time and will not pass.

Mr. Hawkins from the committee delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of certain persons who emigrated into or settled in this state before the adoption of the constitution of the United States; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams, Ordered, That the honorable the council to the governor be requested to lay their proceedings since the last session before the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out and make a public road in Worcester county; and the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Mary Jackson of Worcester county, were severally read the second time and will pass.
