Anggold, of Kent county; a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act authorising appropriations for the penitentiary of this state; a bill entitled, an act authorising Matthias Shaaffner, late sheriff of Washington county, to complete his collections; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Levin Kimmy, of Caroline county, severally passed by that house, Jan. 12, 1814; a bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, passed by that house, Jan. 13, 1814; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 12, 1814.

Resolved, That James Hall and James Butcher be, and they are hereby respectively released from the payment of the judgments obtained in Queen Ann's county court against the said James Hall and Ann Hackett, wife of the said James Butcher, as securities of John B. Hackett, collector of the taxes in the said county, for the year 1801; and that James Brown be, and he is hereby released from the payment of a judgment obtained in the said court against him as security of Richard E. Harrison, collector of the taxes in said county for the year 1802, and that Elizabeth Evorix and Robert Carson be, and they are hereby respectively released from the payment of the judgments obtained in said court against them, or either of them, as securities of the said Richard E. Harrison for the year 1803.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for opening and extending Aiswith street, in the Eastern precincts of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed with an amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act for the making of a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to M'Call's Ferry on the Susquehanna. Ordered, that Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, Brown and N. Williams, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams, Ordered, that the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to authorise the filling up and extending of certain lots on the south side of the Basin, in the city of Baltimore, have a second reading to-morrow, and that the persons interested therein, have leave to be heard by counsel at the bar of the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to extend the powers of the orphans courts of the several counties of this state, in certain cases, was read the second time and will not pass.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams, Ordered, that the second reading of the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to authorise the filling up and extending of certain lots on the south side of the basin in the city of Baltimore, be postponed until to-morrow.

The bill entitled, an act authorising John Newton, late sheriff and collector of Dorchester county to complete his collection, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Thomas Ennalls, late sheriff and collector of Dorchester county, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising the drawing of a lottery or lotteries for the benefit of the University of Maryland, was read the second time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery for finishing and completing the Protestant Episcopal Church in Frederick Town, was read the second time, and the question put, shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
