Also returns the bill entitled, an act to open a road from John Cain's tavern to Berlin, in Frederick county, endorsed, by the house of delegates, Jan. 18, 1814, read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments; which were severally read and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana Bridge, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre-de-Grace, was read the second time, and will pass.

On motion of Mr. Stephen, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act for the advancement of justice *Ordered*, that Messrs. Stephen, N. Williams, and W. Hollingsworth, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia, towards the city of Washington. *Ordered*, that Messrs. N. Williams, L. Hollingsworth and Hebb, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
