

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant heirs of Henry Brook of Montgomery county deceased, passed by that house Jan. 20, 1814; a bill entitled, an act for the support and maintenance of Fielder Moore of Anne-Arundel county; and a bill entitled, an act to alter and change the name of Elizabeth Town in Washington county, to Hager's Town, and to incorporate the same, severally passed by that house Jan. 21, 1814; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also delivers the engrossed bills from No. 1 to 24 inclusive, severally assented to by that house Jan. 21, 1814; and from No. 25 to No. 50 inclusive, severally assented to by that house Jan. 22, 1814; which were severally read and assented to.

On motion of Mr. MacCreery leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the stockholders in the Union Bank of Maryland. Ordered, That Messrs. MacCreery, N. Williams and Stephen be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion of Mr. Stephen, *Ordered*, That the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, have a second reading on Tuesday next the 25th inst.

On motion of Mr. Fenwick, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to authorise the justices of the levy courts, and orphan's courts to grant permits to retailers of spirituous liquors and ordinary keepers in certain cases. Ordered, That Messrs. Fenwick, Hobb and Brown be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. MacCreery from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the stockholders in the Union Bank of Maryland; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act for the preservation of young shad fish in the river Susquehannah, was read the second time, and will pass with the proposed amendments.

*Amendments proposed.*

1st. Strike out the title and insert "a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the preservation of the breed of fish"

2nd. After the word "thereof" in the 7th line of the 1st page insert "shall be more than one and a half inch wide."

3rd. Strike out from the word "inch" in the 9th line of the 1st page to the word "with" in the 10th line of the same page.

4th. Strike out the words "three inches" in the 1st line of the 2nd page and insert "one and an half inch."

5th. After the word "be" in the 8th line of the 2nd page insert "taken destroyed or."

6th. Strike out from the word "charges" in the 2nd line of the 3rd page to the end of the section.

7th. Strike out the third section.

8th. Strike out the fourth section and insert "And be it enacted, that all such parts of the act to which this is a supplement as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act be and are hereby repealed"

The bill entitled, an act authorising Richard Lawrence of Baltimore county to remove a certain negro from the state of Delaware into this state was read the second time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.

*Amendment proposed.*

Strike out from the word "act" in the title to the end thereof and insert "for the benefit of Richard Lawrence."

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the act of Assembly therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act to make public an old road in Harford county, were severally read the second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Caroline county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

*Amendments proposed.*

1st. Strike out from the word "act" in the title to the end thereof, and insert "for the relief of Susan Rouse of Caroline county."

2nd. Strike out the preamble.

3rd. After the word "county" in the 14th line insert "so long as they shall see cause."

4th. After the word "of" in the 16th line strike out the words "the said."

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, was read the second time and will not pass.
