On motion of Mr. W. Hollingsworth, the following resolution was read the first and second time by special order and assented to.

## BY THE SENATE, Jan. 24 1814.

Whereas, It is represented to this General Assembly by the petition of George Gale of Cecil county, that the resolution which passed in his behalf at November session eighteen hundred, erroneously stated the date of a deed therein mentioned from a certain John Ryan to said Gale to be the first of December 1795, instead of the 31st of December 1795, and which deed conveyed a part of a tract of land called New Connaught Manor, whereby the said Gale cannot derive a benefit intended to have been extended to him: Therefore,

Resolved, That the chancellor be, and he is hereby authorised to issue or cause to be issued a patent for a part of New Connaught Manor lying in Cecil county, to and in favor of George Gale of Cecil county, in the manner and on the terms provided by the said resolution, without requiring a new survey to be made of said land, and as if the deed from John Ryan to said Gale had been truly recited in the resolution aforesaid.

## POST MERIDIEM, 5 o'clock.

The senate met. The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Jerusalem Church in Frederick county, and the resolutions in favor of George Gale of Cecil county were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to defray the expences incurred in the trial of criminal prosecutions removed from one county of this state to another, was read the second time and will not pass, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act declaring the river Susquehanna to be a highway, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

## Amendments proposed.

1st. Before the word "highway" in the title of the bill insert "public."

2nd. Before the word "highway" in the 11th line of the bill insert "public."

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Hatfield Wright of Caroline county, was read the second time and will not pass, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to appoint Samuel Ogle trustee for the sale of the real estate of Joseph Ogle late of Frederick county deceased; a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Jesse Jarrett, Henry Scarf and others; a bill entitled, an act to authorise the raising a sum of money by a lottery or lotteries to build an arsenal for the city of Baltimore and for other purposes; and a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of Gerard Briscoe late of Charles county deceased, severally passed by that house Jan. 24, 1814; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia towards the city of Washington, endorsed, by the house of delegates Jan. 24, 1814, read the second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state; and the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, were severally read the second time and will not pass.
