

The bill entitled, an act for the aid of the Baltimore General Dispensary; the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Sarah B. Parker, of Calvert county; the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out a certain road in Baltimore county, and the bill entitled, an act relating to the court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for Baltimore county, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled, an act to revive an act entitled, an act to punish certain crimes and misdemeanors, and to prevent the growth of toryism, passed February session, seventeen hundred and seventy seven, and on progression in reading, the question was put, will the senate amend the title by striking out the word "revive" and inserting "declare in force." Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read, the question was put, shall this bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money to make a turnpike road from Frederick Town to Harper's Ferry, and for other purposes, passed at November session eighteen hundred and twelve. *Ordered*, that Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, Hawkins and Holbrook be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money to make a turnpike road from Frederick Town to Harper's Ferry, and for other purposes, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and twelve; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to fix and regulate the quality of silver plate manufactured or sold or offered for sale in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Beneficial Society; a bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act to alter and repeal several parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the division of Annapolis county into election districts, a bill entitled, an act for the sale of the real estate of Thomas Parran, late of Calvert county, deceased; a bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Chalmers and Alexis Romain, of the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a market house in the Eastern precincts of Baltimore, and a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Edward Calver's old mill in Prince George's county, to the District of Columbia, severally passed that house, Jan. 28, 1814; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the District of Columbia to the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "by the house of delegates, Jan. 28, 1814; read the second time, and will not pass."

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Abner Neale, Francis Wills and John Cole, of the city of Baltimore, and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Chalmers and Alexis Romain, of the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time by special order, and will pass.

The bill entitled, an act authorising and directing the sale of the real estate of William Hammond, (son of Wm.) late of Anne Arundel county, deceased, and the bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate held by Joseph B. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased, were severally read the second time, and will not pass.

The following message was read and agreed to:

BY THE SENATE, January 28, 1814.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

The senate has negatived the bill passed by your house, entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate held by Joseph B. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased. This bill is founded upon a representation that the legal title to the land which is therein proposed to be sold is in Joseph B. M'Kean, in trust for the children of Andrew Buchanan, deceased. When it appears by the copy of the deed annexed to the petition, that no legal estate passed from Thomas M'Kean to Joseph B. M'Kean, under that deed, it having been acknowledged by the grantor before two aldermen of the city of Philadelphia, in the state of Pennsylvania, and not according to the laws of this state. The legal title to the land described in the bill consequently remains in Thomas M'Kean, one of the petitioners, who has full power to dispose of it, without the authority of this legislature.
