FRIDAY, December 16.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in favor of Richard Taylor was sent to the senate.

Mr. Barney delivers a petition from John West, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to the committee on similar petitions.

Mr. Lecompt delivers a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain lands, late the property of William Insley, late of Dorchester county, deceased. Which was read.

Mr. Emory delivers a bill, entitled, an act annulling the marriage of William Glanvill, and Sarah his wife. Which was read.

Mr. Stonestreet delivers a petition from Nehemiah Cawford, and a petition from John N. Robey, old soldiers, praying relief which were read and referred to Messrs Stonestreet, Ford and Jenkins.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the Clerk of Baltimore county court, relative to the attendance of the judges. Which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of William Roberts, of Aleghany county, report, That they have had the same under consideration and find the facts therein stated to be true, they therefore submit the following resolution:

Resolved, that the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto William Roberts, late a private in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private for life, as a further remuneration to him for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

On motion by Mr. Long, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts. Ordered that Messrs. Long, Bayly and Wilson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, an act to change the place of holding the election in the third election district in Caroline county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kell delivers a petition from Elizabeth Sherloch and Robert Gilmor, junr. of the city of Baltimore, praying that they may be authorised to sell certain real property belonging to the infant heirs of John Sherloch. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Kell, J. H. Thomas and Wilson.

Mr. Bayly delivers a petition from lieutenant colonel Thomas Humphrey, of Somerset county, praying compensation for certain military services rendered by himself and his staff. Which was read and referred to the military committee.

Mr. Bradford from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying for a public road to be opened from George Cairn's bars on the Coop town road by Nicholas Day M'Comas's gate, and so forth, Report that they have had the same under their consideration and find that the petitioners have neglected to notify their intention as required by a resolution of the general assembly passed at May session, 1813.

Your committee conceiving the notice required by said resolution indispensable, are therefore of opinion that the prayer of the petitioners cannot with propriety be granted and that they have leave to withdraw their petition.
