BY THE COMMITTEE OF CLAIMS.

Your committee beg leave to report, that they have examined the accounts and proceedings of William Richardson, treasurer of the Eastern shore of Maryland, and find by an account settled by the committee of claims, to the first day of December, 1813, there was a balance remaining in the treasury of \$ 446 32 1 2, and that he hath received from the first day of December, 1813, to the first day of December, 1814, for escheat, caution, composition, and improvements on land, \$ 1948 47 1 2; for marriage, ordinary, Pedlar, and retailers licences, fines, forfeitures, amerciaments and chancery taxes, \$ 6347 29; from William Chambers, late treasure of the Eastern shore, \$ 200 00. That it appears to your committee, that said treasurer, hath paid away from the first day of December, 1813, to the tenth day of December, 1814, inclusive, \$ 8480 13, in which sum is included his salary for one year; for all which payments, have been produced to your committee, the necessary vouchers and receipts, and that there remains in the treasury the sum of \$ 461 96.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain lands, late the property of William Insley, late of Dorchester county, deceased, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge, passed by the senate, December 19; and a communication from the executive relative to the index to the laws passed since 1799, directed by a resolution of the late session. Which was read and referred to the committee, on the petition of John N. Watkins.

Mr. Lantz delivers a bill, entitled, an act to change the place of holding the election, in the fourth election district, in Allegany county. Which was read.

Mr. Bayly delivers a petition from the stockholders of the Bank of Somerset, praying a supplement to their charter. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Bayly, Neale and Waller.

Mr. Riggs from the committee, delivers the following report:

The bill, entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill, entitled, an act for the support of James Upton, of Baltimore county. Which was read.

Mr. Mitchell delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Cecil county, praying that a road may be opened from Elkton to the Delaware line, towards Newark in Delaware. Which was read, and referred to Messrs. Mitchell, Evans and Hogg.

The bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Henry Howard, (of John) of Montgomery county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kilgour delivers a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the widow and heirs of William Holland, of Montgomery county. Which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill, entitled, an act to provide for holding the court of appeals, for the Western Shore, alternately, at the cities of Baltimore and Annapolis, and a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the banks in this state, to issue small notes for a limited time, and for other purposes, severally passed by the senate, December 19; and the bill, entitled, an act to confirm certain acts of justices of the peace, who hold or have held offices under the general government, endorsed,
