THURSDAY, *December 29.*

The house met. Present the same members as on Thursday last, except Mr Van Horn. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Robert I. H. Hardy, Esquire, a delegate returned for Worcester county, and John Cotmen, Esquire, a delegate returned for Some set county, appeared, qualified and took their seats in the house.

Mr Kell delivers a petition from Thomas W. Griffith, collector of Baltimore county, and a petition from William Merryman, late sheriff and collector of Baltimore county, praying that they may be authorised to complete their respective collections. Which were read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Stansbury and Randall.

Mr. Kell delivers a memorial from the visitors of the poor of the city of Baltimore, praying that a law may pass, extending the period of female apprenticeship. Which were read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Barney, Warner, Stansbury and Duvall.

Also a petition from George Grundy, of the city of Baltimore, praying that the state will relinquish its right to certain land, in Baltimore county. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Wilson and Randall.

Mr Hambleton delivers a petition from Jacob Gibson, of Talbot county, praying that certain expenses incurred by him, for the transportation of two pieces of artillery from Baltimore to Saint Michaels, may be refunded. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hambleton, A. Hands, Bayly, Randall and Kilgour.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants, of the city of Baltimore, praying that all the public wharves in the city of Baltimore, may be placed on the same footing with those of Light street and Lee street. Mr. Barney delivers a petition from Samuel McClellan and George H. Seckel, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Barney, Wilson, and Crabb.

Mr. Schnebly delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants, of Washington county, praying the incorporation of a company, to make a turnpike road from Swearingen's ferry, on the Potomac, to Boon's borough. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Schnebly, Gabby and Tilghman.

Mr. Bradford delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying the establishment of a bank at Havre-de-Grace. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Bradford, Dallam and Kell.

Mr. Kell delivers a bill, entitled, an act authorising the sale of a lot of ground in the city of Baltimore, owned by the children of John Sherlock, deceased. Which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate a company, to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the district of Columbia, towards the city of Washington, passed by the senate, December 29; also the bill, entitled, an act to repeal part of an act, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the relief of the poor of Frederick county, passed at November session 1811, and for other purposes, endorsed, "will not pass;" and the bill, entitled, an act to authorise Isaac S. Swearingen, of Washington county, to remove a certain negro boy from Virginia into this state, endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.
