Mr. Taney delivers a petition from Henry Hickson, of Frederick county, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Taney, Howard and J. Thomas.

Mr. Kilgour delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church, or congregation in this state, passed at November session, 1802. Which was read.

Mr. Barney delivers a petition from sundry proprietors of lots on Sharp street, praying that a law may pass to confirm the location of said street, as made on the 22d of November, 1809. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Barney, Kell and Dorsey.

On motion by Mr. Hogg, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the river Susquehanna, by Charleston to the Elkton and Christiana turnpike road. Ordered, that Messrs. Hogg, Wilson and M. Mahon, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, Ordered, that the committee on the memorial of John Brewer, register of the Land office for the Western Shore, be enlarged by the addition of Messrs. Quinton and Hilleary.

Mr. Ford delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of George N. Ford, late of Charles county, deceased. Which was read.

Mr. Worthington delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Ralf Basil, senr. of the city of Annapolis. Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Jones delivers a petition from William Wilson, of Jno. of Montgomery county, praying that a law may pass enabling him to procure a renewal of certain tobacco notes, which have been stolen from him. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jones, Kilgour and Riggs.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the division of Alleghany county, into election districts; and the bill entitled, an act for repairing the bridge over Tuckahoe creek, near Hillsborough, severally endorsed, "will not pass." The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel, M'Ceilan and George H. Seckel, of the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. And the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of the poor of Queen Ann's county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read.

According to the order of the day, the house proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled, a supplement to the act passed at December session, 1813, chapter 118, entitled, an act to prohibit the collection of certain wharfages within the city of Baltimore, and the question put, shall the said bill pass. Resolved in the affirmative.
