Mr. Stevens a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the Presbyterian congregation of Queen Ann's and Caroline counties; and Mr. Crabb a bill entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state. The speaker laid before the house a communication from the treasurer of the Western Shore, accompanied by a letter from the president of the Union Manufacturing Company, offering to the state fifty shares of their augmented stock. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Dorsey, Kell, and J. Thomas.

Mr. J. Thomas delivers a petition from John Phillips of Frederick county, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to the standing committee on similar petitions.

Mr. Duvall delivers a petition from William Wells, of the city of Annapolis, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to the standing committee on similar petitions.

Mr. Randal delivers a bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Baltimore county, and Mr. Duvall a bill entitled, an act to pay the civil list and other expenses of civil government. Which were severally read.

Mr. Duvall delivers a petition from Elizabeth Gwinn and Thomas Harris Junr. of the city of Annapolis, praying that the orphans court may be authorised to appropriate part of the principal arising from the sale of the real estate of John Gwinn, to the support and education of his infant children.
