The bill entitled, a supplement to an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Bank of Caroline, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. On motion by Mr. Quinton, Ordered, that the clerk prepare immediately a docket of the bills and reports upon the table, arranging the same according to priority of date, and add thereto from time to time such as may be hereafter reported.

The bill entitled, an act to empower Burgess Willett, executor of Robert W. Fleming, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, to collect fees and county tax put into his hands for collection during his life time, was read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. Kilgour, Ordered, that the treasurer of the Western Shore be requested to lay before this house an account of the whole amount of the money heretofore appropriated for the penitentiary.

Mr. Wright delivers a petition from Henry Wilmer, of Queen Ann's county, praying a special act of insolvency. Which was read and referred to the standing committee on similar applications.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the sale of certain lands in Baltimore county, late the property of John Ridgely, deceased, was read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. Blackistone, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act providing for the calling out and detaching the militia of this state, and for other purposes. Ordered, that Messrs. Blackistone, Stonestreet and Neale, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Potter, Leave given to bring in a bill to authorise and empower the orphans courts of this state, to extend the time for executors and administrators to pass their final accounts.

Mr. Duvall delivers a petition from Elizabeth Bryan, of Anne Arundel county, praying that the Levy court may be authorised to levy a sum of money for her support. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Duvall, Worthington and Dorsey.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Powhatan manufacturing company of Maryland, passed by the senate January 19. Which was read. And the bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to appoint commissioners to grade and level the squares, streets, lanes and alleys, in the precincts of Baltimore, west of Jones's Falls, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill for the relief of William Wilson, of Jno. of Montgomery county, and to the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna near Rock run, were severally read the second time, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Willie Janes, of Montgomery county, was read the second time, and passed.

The bill entitled, an act to increase the compensation of the justices of the orphans court of Baltimore county, was read the second time, and the question put, shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Hose company. And the bill entitled, an act relinquishing the right of the state of Maryland, in a tract of land called M'Leans Recovery, in Baltimore county, to George Grundy, of the city of Baltimore, were severally read the second time by special order, and passed.
