The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to confirm the sale of the real estate of Curtis Hitch, late of Somerset county, deceased, endorsed, "will not pass;" and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Willie Janes, of Montgomery county, endorsed, "will pass" Ordered to be engrossed. Also a bill entitled, a second supplement to the act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed this day by the senate. Which was read.

Mr. Hood presented a petition from Singleton Warfield, of Anne Arundel county, praying that a law may pass authorising the levy court of Anne Arundel county, to levy on the assessable property of said county, a small sum of money for his support. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hood, Worthington and Dorsey.

Mr. Stansbury from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to appoint commissioners to grade, level, pave and repair the streets, squares, lanes and alleys in that part of the Eastern Precincts of Baltimore therein described, and for other purposes. Which was read.

Mr. Kell from the committee, delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising the criminal court of Baltimore to make the assessments therein mentioned. Which was read.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the river Susquehannah, through Charles town to the Elkton and Christianna turnpike road; and on motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, shall the words "through Charles town," be stricken out from the title of the bill?
