

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

The *se* proceeded on motion by Mr. Crabb, to the consideration of the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from Baltimore to the District of Columbia towards the city of Washington, and some progress having been made in reading the same, on motion by Mr. Van Horn, the question was put that the house reject the bill? Resolved in the affirmative and the bill returned to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of John M.A. Zollikoffer, endorsed, "will not pass." And the bill entitled, an act extending the benefit of the insolvent laws to certain petitioners therein mentioned, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments." Which amendments were read, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Crabb, the following resolutions were read.

Resolved, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorised to establish from time to time, such rules and regulations for the recruiting service of the troops authorised to be raised by an act entitled, an act to provide for the better defence of the state and to prevent the necessity of frequent calls of the militia as they shall judge proper, and that the bounty for every non commissioned, musician and private who shall enlist in the said troops shall be _____ dollars to be paid at the time of enlistment.

Resolved, That for the bounties and other necessary expenses attending the raising of said troops, there shall be appropriated the sum of _____ dollars, to be paid by the treasurer of the Western Shore, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The bill from the senate entitled, an act for the benefit of Elizabeth Brewer, of the city of Annapolis, was read the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

The preamble and resolutions for providing look out boats, were read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Barney, the question was put that the blank (for the appropriation) be filled up with eight thousand dollars? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
