BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, February 3, 1815.

*Gentlemen of the senate,*

We had contemplated closing the session last night as proposed in your message, but we were prevented from returning you an answer to that effect, from the circumstance of this house being occupied in business, when it was understood the senate had adjourned. We propose with your concurrence to close the session to-day. Messrs. John H. Thomas and Caldwell, are appointed on the part of this house, to join the gentlemen named by your body, to wait upon his excellency the governor, and request his attendance in the senate chamber, at such hour as may be convenient for you to appoint, to sign and seal the laws agreeably to the constitution and form of government.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the several free-schools in the city and precincts of Baltimore, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act for the preservation of deer in Baltimore county, were read the second time and dissented from.

Mr. Van Horn moved the following order:

*Ordered*, That the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to regulate and discipline the militia of this state, as it passed this house, together with the amendments proposed thereto by the senate, be printed in the *Maryland Gazette*, the *American at Baltimore*, and the *Monitor at Easton*, for the information of the good people of this state.
