

States? Resolved in the affirmative, and the resolution returned to the senate.

The resolution from the senate directing that no officer of the Legislature shall receive hereafter, any compensation for any extraordinary services, was read the second time, *unanimously dissented from*, and returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the question was put, that the house reconsider the bill entitled, an act for the payment of the civil list, and other expenses of civil government. Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the question was put, that the words "one thousand two hundred dollars," in that part of the bill which fixes the salary of the printer to the state, be stricken out for the purpose of inserting "one thousand four hundred and forty three dollars." Determined in the negative. The bill was passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Warner, the following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. J. H. Thomas, Ordered, that when this house adjourn it stand adjourned until the first Monday in October next.

Messrs. Worthington and Fenwick inform the Speaker that the governor is attending in the senate chamber to sign and seal the laws, and request his attendance, and that of the members of this house.

The Speaker left the chair, and accompanied by the members proceeded to the senate chamber, and there presented the following engrossed bills to the governor, who assigned the same, and affixed the great seal thereto, in the presence of both houses.

No. 1. An act to confirm certain acts of justices of the peace, who hold, or have held offices under the general government.

2. An act authorising the trustees of the Roman Catholic church, in the city of Baltimore, to purchase a lot to be used as a burying ground.

3. An act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for the relief of John Messler and David Rinehart, trustees of James Farquhar, of Frederick county, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and twelve.

4. An act for the relief of Sarah Ellis, and her children, of the city of Baltimore.

5. An act to lay out a road in Dorchester county.

6. An act further supplementary to an act passed at November session, eighteen hundred and eleven, entitled, an act authorising Elizabeth Luckett, of Frederick county, to remove certain negroes into the state of Maryland.

7. An act to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year.

8. An act to authorise Isaac S. Sweringen, of Washington county, to remove a certain negro boy from the state of Virginia into this state.

9. A further supplement to the act passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-five, chapter twenty-seven, entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate the subscribers thereto.

10. An act to incorporate the Baltimore Beneficial society.

11. An act for the relief of Henry Howard, of Jno. of Montgomery county.

12. An act for incorporating the Brookeville academy in Montgomery county.

13. An act to revive and make valid the proceedings of, the orphans' court of Saint Mary's county.

14. An act to confirm and make valid the last will and testament of William M'Creery, late of Baltimore county, deceased.

15. An act to lay out and make public a road in Baltimore county.

16. An act for the relief of Philip Gayman, jr. of the city of Baltimore.

17. An act to change a part of the public road leading from Black-water river to the head of Hungar river, in Dorchester county.

18. An act to lay out, open and establish a new road in Washington county.

19. An act to lay out and make public a road in Frederick county.

20. An act to lay out and make public a certain cross road in Frederick county.

21. A supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company, under the name of the Comorocheague bank, in William's port, in Washington county.

22. A further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to the Christiana bridge.

23. An act to incorporate the Franklin manufacturing company of Maryland.

24. An act for the relief of Joshua Hicks and Ephraim Buckingham, of Baltimore county.
