States? Resolved in the affirmative, and the resolution returned to the senate.

The resolution from the senate directing that no officer of the Legislature shall receive hereafter, any compensation for any extraordinary services, was read the second time, unanimously dissented from, and returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the question was put, that the house reconsider the bill entitled, an act for the payment of the civil list, and other expenses of civil government. Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the question was put, that the words "one thousand two hundred dollars," in that part of the bill which fixes the salary of the printer to the state, be stricken out for the purpose of instring "one thousand four hundred and torty three dallars." Determined in the negative. The bill was passed and sent to the senate.
