SATURDAY, December 17

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. W. Hollingsworth presented a petition from sundry inhabitants of Elkton and its vicinity, stockholders in the Elk and Christiana turnpike company, praying an amendment to their charter, authorising them to receive toll between Elkton and Elk landing. Which was read and referred to Messrs. W. Hollingsworth, L. Hollingsworth and Brown to consider and report thereon.

Mr. W. Hollingsworth from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah Ellis and her children, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president laid before the senate a letter from Mr. William G. D. Worthington, accepting his appointment as a member of the senate. Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Hebb, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Conococheague bank, in Williams Port in Washington county. Ordered, that Messrs. Hebb, Fenwick and W. Hollingsworth be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
