BY THE SENATE, December 21, 1814.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing to go this day into the election of an United States senator, and after deliberating thereon, have concluded that it is unnecessary and inexpedient to make the election at this time: there is now no vacancy in the representation of this state in the senate of the United States; and should there be another session of congress before the next meeting of the next general assembly (the term of a senator having then expired) the constitution of the United States provides that the executive of the state may supply such vacancy by a temporary appointment.
