Mr. Williams presented a petition from Charles H. Appleton, and others of the city of Baltimore, proprietors of an establishment for the manufacture of paper, and woollen and cotton yarn, praying an act of incorporation. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Williams, Fenwick and L. Hollingsworth, to consider and report thereon.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal part of an act entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for the relief of the poor of Frederick county, passed at November session eighteen hundred and eleven, and for other purposes, was read the second time, and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the senate proceed immediately to the election of a director on the part of the state in the bank of Baltimore.

The senate proceeded to said election, and the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, on examination thereof it appeared that Edward Johnson was unanimously elected.

Whereupon it is declared in the senate that Edward Johnson is unanimously elected a director on the part of the state in the bank of Baltimore.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise Isaac S. Swearingen, of Washington county, to remove a certain negro boy from the state of Virginia into this state. And the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the district of Columbia towards the city of Washington, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the support of James Upton, of Baltimore county. A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of Robert Gorsuch, late collector of Baltimore county. And a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore beneficial society, severally passed by that house December 29, 1814. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also returns a bill entitled, an act to authorise the banks of this state to issue small notes for a limited time, and for other purposes, passed by that house December 29, 1814. Ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Frazier appeared in the senate.

Mr. Williams from the committee, delivers a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Franklin manufacturing company of Maryland. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, *Ordered*, that the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of Robert Gorsuch, late collector of Baltimore county. And the bill entitled, an act authorising Edward Wood, former collector of Calvert county, to complete his collection, be committed to a special committee.

Ordered, That Messrs. Williams, Worthington and Stephen, be the said committee.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under (the title of the Bank of Somerset, passed by that house December 29, 1814. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also returns the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Conococheague bank of Williams-port, in Washington county, passed by that house December 29, 1814. Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act passed at November session seventeen hundred and ninety-five, chapter twenty seven, entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate the subscribers thereto, was read the second time and will pass.
