

Mr. Frazier delivers a petition from Walter L. Rawleigh, of Dorchester county, praying a confirmation of the will of his brother Levin Rawleigh. Which was read and referred to Mr. Frazier, Mr. Fenwick and Mr. J. Williams to consider and report thereon.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Walter Price, of the city of Annapolis, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Ann Hollidayoke, of the city of Annapolis, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Charles Rice, of Washington county. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Coursey, of Kent county in the state of Delaware, and a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Company of Snow Hill, severally passed by that house the 16th day of January, 1815. And a bill entitled, a supplement to an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Bank of Caroline. A bill entitled, an act to straighten and amend a road in Harford county. A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the congregation of United Brethren or Moravian Society, a Grace in Frederick county. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Wilson of John, of Montgomery county, severally passed by that house on the 17th of January 1815. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table; and the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 16, 1815.

Whereas, it has always been considered not only a generous, but a wise policy, in all free governments to evince in the most pointed manner, their high sense of the gallantry and good conduct of such of their citizens as have devoted their time and talents to the public good.

And whereas, colonel Philip Reid did on the thirteenth day of August last, in a masterly and heroic manner, with an inferior force composed of militia, defeat and repel a marauding party of the enemy in Kent county, killing their leader, sir Peter Parker, and fourteen of his men, and wounding a number of others, thereby evincing to the enemy and the world, that the arms of freemen, when used in defence of their liberties, their wives, their children and their fire sides, are invincible, and also thereby evincing to his countrymen that the same statesman who in his legislative capacity of senator from Maryland, voted against the declaration of war, was the patriot and hero, who was amongst the foremost in his military capacity to step forward and repel an invading foe, when polluting the sovereignty of our soil by their unhallowed tread. Therefore,

Resolved unanimously, that the governor of this state be, and he is hereby requested to address in the name of the state of Maryland, a letter to col. Philip Reid, of Kent county, expressive of the very high sense entertained of the intripidity, gallantry, and good conduct of him and his brave associates in repelling the enemy in his attack on the militia of Kent county on the 30th day of August last, and driving him with confusion and loss to his shipping.

WEDNESDAY, January 18.

The bill entitled, an act to annul the marriage of Conrad Haltzman, late of Frederick county, and Eve Holtzman, now of Washington county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to regulate the breadth of a certain road in Kent county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegate by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church or congregation in this state, passed at November session 1802, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
