Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Ralph Basil, senr. of the city of Annapolis, was read the second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, was read the second time, and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed

1st. Strike out the words "and the time for completing the same, be, and hereby is extended to eight years," in the enterlineations between the third and fifth lines of the enacting clause.

2d. At the end of the bill add "and be it enacted, that such of the banks as may have accepted the terms prescribed by the act to which this is a further supplement, subsequent to the time required by that act or which may accept the same before the first day of June next, shall have and be entitled to all the benefits and privileges contained in the act to which this is a further supplement.

The senate adjourns until to morrow morning nine o'clock.
